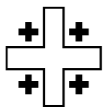

K. Samuel Lee, Ph.D.

“Much Depends on the Kitchen: Pastoral Practice in Multicultural Society” The Rev. Dr. Lee’s scholarly interests include multicultural pastoral practice, pastoral care and counseling with culturally diverse clients, and multi-culturalism in theological education. A clergy ordained by the United Methodist Church, with over ten years experience as a local church pastor, Dr. Lee is a clinically trained counseling psychologist who brings empirical research expertise and the psychotherapy competence. In recent years, Dr. Lee contributed to the development and adoption of multicultural competencies for the Association for Clinical Pastoral Education. He also serves as the Executive Director of The Clinebell Institute for Pastoral

Counseling and Psychotherapy, a clinical training center for students which also provides pastoral care and counseling service for the wider community in Los Angeles.

“World Without Walls – a Multi-Cultural Typology.”

The Rev. Dr. Steven Voytovich is a descendent of Slavic immigrants from Galicia and a priest in the Orthodox Church in America (OCA). He is a certified chaplain, CPE supervisor, and a licensed professional counselor. Steven is currently the Director of Pastoral Care at the Hospital of Saint Raphael and pastor of St. Alexis Orthodox Christian Church from its foundation as a mission, both in the state of Connecticut in the U.S. Steven has significantly contributed to the development of institutional chaplaincy within the OCA, serving as Director of the recently established Institutional Chaplaincy Department. He is a clinical faculty member of the Indigenous CPE Training Team that is presently involved with the CPE Program in

Malaysia. He is currently the Convener of the New York/ New Jersey Chapter of the College of Pastoral Supervision and Psychotherapy (CPSP) that has supported this partnering in clinical training. He has also served on the Executive Committee of the International Congress for Pastoral Care and Counseling.

“Pastoral Care as Wounded Story Telling and Listening: Issues of Indigenous Ministry in the Multi-Cultural & Multi-Faith Realities of Globalization”

The Rev. Dr. John de Velder, President of the Council on Ministry in Specialized Settings, Past-President (2002) of the College of Pastoral Supervision & Psychotherapy, is a Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) supervisor and has Directed the Pastoral Care Department at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital in New Brunswick, N.J. for the past twenty-five years. He has trained hundreds of CPE students in the multi-cultural context of Central New Jersey. As a clinical faculty team member of the Indigenous CPE Training Program, he participated in the training in Korea, Singapore, and now Malaysia. Prior to

his study at Hope College, Holland, Michigan, Rev. deVelder lived with his missionary parents in Xiamen, China; Cebu, Philippines; and Hong Kong. He is a graduate of New Brunswick Theological Seminary and received the Doctor of Ministry degree from New York Seminary. He is a certified Diplomat of the College of Pastoral Supervision and Psychotherapy. He is married to Linda Walvoord and has two adult children, Rebecca and David.
