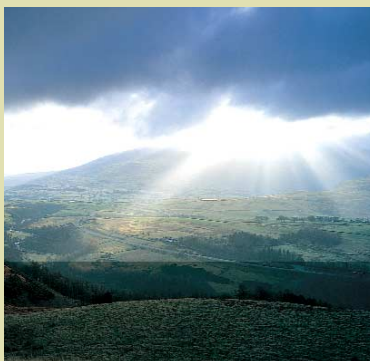

## Speakers

DR. JOHN KINNEY will be a presenter at our national conference this year. Dr. Kinney is a native of Wheeling, West Virginia and has received undergraduate and graduate degrees from Marshall University and Virginia Union University School of Theology. He was awarded the Ph.D. in 1979 from Columbia/Union Theological Seminary in New York. Dr. Kinney is Dean of the School of Theology at Virginia Union and the head of the Doctor of Ministry Program, which he has established. Among his publications and research activities are: "Delivered From the Pit, God Lifts Us Up", American Baptist Quarterly, XI No. 1 (March 1992). "Surprise! Surprise! Surprise! Are Women To Preach or Not to Preach", Ellen P. Mitchell ed. Valley Forge Junction Press, 1991. He is, at the present time, developing works on "Theological Methodology in the Black Church" and "Spirituality and Justice".

DR. ESTEBAN MONTILLA will present Counseling and Supervising Latinos and Latinas: A Collective in Competency-Based Approach. He comments that the growth, expansion, and strengthening of the Latino community is a reality that is overtaking the United States at a dramatic pace. This reality challenges educators, clergy and clinicians to sharpen their multicultural and multidimensional awareness, growth, and skills in working with Hispanics. He serves as the Director of Clinical Pastoral Education at Driscoll Children's Hospital, Corpus Christi, Texas. He earned his MS in Community Counseling and Ph.D. in Counseling Clinical Supervision from Texas A&M. He recently published a book entitled, "Pastoral Care and Counseling with Latinos/as."

DR. CAROL SCHWEITZER will address "Pastoral Wisdom: Understanding the Relationship Between Loss and Personal Vulnerability in Conflict Situations." She is Assistant Professor of Pastoral Care at Union Theological Seminary/PSCE. She is an ordained minister in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. She holds degrees from Westminster Choir College, Princeton, NJ and Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. Until 2001 she was a teaching fellow in Pastoral Theology and Practical Theology at Princeton Theological Seminary. She has been published in Interpretation-59:3 July 2005 and Pastoral Psychology 52: – November 2003, and is getting ready to publish her first book on the topic being presented at our conference.
