About The Speaker

The North Carolina Psychoanalytic Foundation is pleased to present Jonathan Shay, MD, PhD, critically acclaimed author of *Achilles in Vietnam: Combat Trauma and the Undoing of Character* and *Odysseus in America: Combat Trauma and the Trials of Homecoming* (with joint Foreword by Senators John McCain and Max Cleland). Educated at Harvard and the University of Pennsylvania, Dr. Shay is a psychiatrist for the United States Department of Veterans Affairs in Boston where he has worked for more than 15 years with combat veterans.

About the Program

In this program, Dr. Shay will illuminate the nature of catastrophic war experiences and the spiritual and psychological obstacles combat veterans face in returning to civilian life. Participants will learn individual, family and community approaches to assisting the returning veteran and hear his practical call for prevention of psychological and moral injury in military service.

Audience

The Annual Public Lecture (3-5pm) is open to the general public and mental health professionals and is relevant to active military, veterans (of any war) and the people who care for them.

The Professional Workshop (which includes the public lecture) is open to all mental health professionals who treat PTSD or who work with active duty personnel or combat veterans and their family members, including psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, nurses, counselors, substance abuse professionals, family doctors, chaplains and pastoral counselors. The morning session (10am-1pm) will focus on Diagnosis, Psychotherapy and Medication for PTSD while the afternoon session (3pm-5pm) will focus on Reintegration into the Family and Community (open to the public). The morning session

will be co-taught with Harold Kudler, MD, Associate Clinical Professor, Duke University Medical Center, and Co-chair, Veterans Administration Under-Secretary's Special Committee on PTSD.
